Heritage Crystal Clean, Inc.

July 2010 - Heritage-Crystal Clean, Inc. announced it has selected Indianapolis as the site for its used oil re-refining facility and intends to create up to 75 new jobs by 2013. The company, which provides services for parts cleaning, containerized waste management, used oil collection and vacuum truck services to customers in the automotive service and manufacturing industries, expects to invest approximately \$40 million to construct and equip a used oil re-refinery in Speedway.

The Indiana Economic Development Corporation offered Heritage Crystal-Clean up to \$550,000 in performance-based tax credits based on the company's job creation plans. Up to an additional \$100,000 will be made available to the city of Indianapolis for infrastructure improvements from the state's Industrial Development Grant Fund. The city of Indianapolis has granted Heritage Crystal-Clean a \$2.3 million property tax abatement and \$150,000 for additional infrastructure assistance at the request of Develop Indy.

Mitsubishi Heavy Industry Climate Control (MCC)

May 2010 – MCC, a Franklin manufacturing facility is planning a \$9.4 million expansion project that would more than double employment over the next two years (potentially 65 new employees). The company, which is owned by Tokyo-based Mitsubishi Heavy Industries Ltd., plans to spend \$8.9 million on equipment and \$450,000 on the facility. They expect to begin hiring at the end of 2011.

Franklin City Council members approved a pair of 10-year tax abatements for Mitsubishi Heavy Industry Climate Control.

CPS, Inc.

May 2010 - CPS Inc., a manufacturer of corrugated food packaging products announced it will establish manufacturing operations in Hamilton County, creating up to 22 new jobs by 2013. The company, which manufactures cake pads, circle trays, pizza boxes and other corrugated packaging products for food and industrial uses, will invest more than \$1.5 million to lease and equip an existing 64,800 square-foot manufacturing facility in Westfield.

The Indiana Economic Development Corporation offered up to \$100,000 in performance-based tax credits based on the company's job creation plans. The city of Westfield will consider additional property tax abatement.

Just Packaging Indianapolis, Inc.

April 2010 - Just Packaging Indianapolis, Inc., announced it will site its newest manufacturing center in Indianapolis, creating up to 30 new jobs by 2012. The company, which manufactures corrugated products for customers in a variety of industries, will invest more than \$1.9 million to lease and equip an existing 60,000 square-foot facility on the Indianapolis' east side.

The Indiana Economic Development Corporation offered Just Packaging Indianapolis, Inc. up to \$160,000 in performance-based tax credits based on the company's job creation plans. The city of Indianapolis will provide additional property tax abatement.

Ryobi Die Casting

April 2010 - Ryobi Die Casting USA Inc. unveiled plans to expand operations in Shelbyville, adding 72 jobs. The company has been given a 10-year tax abatement on \$17.3 million in new equipment for a new production line to make transmission casings for Hyundai Motors.

Ryobi Die Casting opened its Shelbyville location in 1986 and currently employs approximately 621 workers.

Rexam

March 2010 - Rexam, a manufacturer of packaging for consumer products, announced it will expand its operations in Franklin, creating up to 46 new jobs by the end of 2010. The company manufactures plastic packaging for the health care, closures and personal care industries, along with aluminum beverage cans.

The Indiana Economic Development Corporation offered Rexam up to \$250,000 in performance-based tax credits and up to \$48,000 in training grants based on the company's job creation plans. Up to \$100,000 will be made available to the city of Franklin for infrastructure improvements at the site. The city of Franklin will consider additional property tax abatement.
