

Earnest Machine Products Company

July 2010 - Earnest Machine has selected Indianapolis for its Midwest consolidation. The company expects to create 16 new jobs and invest \$1.2 million in the consolidation. It is no coincidence that Earnest, a manufacturer and distributor of more than 35,000 standard and custom fasteners, has consolidated its Ohio and Iowa operations to Indiana. With the logistical advantages of the new Indianapolis location, Earnest's fill rate, inventory availability and same day shipping capacity will increase.

The Indiana Economic Development Corporation offered Earnest Machine Products up to \$100,000 in performance-based tax credits based on the company's job creation plans.

Johnson & Johnson

June 2010 - Johnson & Johnson is building a warehouse in Hendricks County that is expected to create 465 jobs when completed in mid-2011. The distribution arm of the New Jersey-based manufacturer of health care and consumer products is building the facility at Interstate 70 and State Road 39.

The Hendricks County Council approved a 10-year property-tax abatement. The Indiana Economic Development Corp. will provide Hendricks County with \$300,000 to help with infrastructure improvements, and the Indiana Department of Transportation will kick in \$400,000 for additional road improvements.

Southern Wine & Spirits

June 2010 - Southern Wine and Spirits of Indiana Inc., announced it will locate its newest regional office and distribution center in Greenwood, creating a combined 200 new jobs at two Central Indiana facilities.

The company, which distributes beer, wine and distilled spirits through a network of distribution centers across the country, will invest more than \$10 million to establish a 200,000 sq. ft. distribution center in Greenwood and approximately 7,500 sq. ft. of office space in Indianapolis. The facilities are the distributor's first in Indiana.

Southern Wine & Spirits (cont.)

The Indiana Economic Development Corporation offered Southern Wine and Spirits up to \$1.4 million in performance-based tax credits based on the company's job creation plans. The city of Greenwood and the city of Indianapolis will consider additional property tax abatement.

Tailgate Beer, Inc.

April 2010 - TailGate Beer, an artisan packaging brewery of craft beers, announced it will expand its national operations in Franklin, creating up to 150 new jobs over the next three years. TailGate Beer will invest millions in machinery, equipment and energy efficiency upgrades.

The Indiana Economic Development Corporation offered up to \$1.85 million in performance-based tax credits and \$100,000 in training grants based on the company's job creation plans. The city of Franklin will consider additional incentives.

s2f worldwide, LLC

March 2010 - s2f worldwide, LLC, a startup provider of supply chain and logistics services, announced it will establish its headquarters and distribution operations in Plainfield, creating 250 new jobs by 2013. The company offers a range of transportation management, warehousing and distribution services, and will invest \$10.8 million to lease and equip a 200,000sf distribution center and office building.

The Indiana Economic Development Corporation offered up to \$2 million in performance-based tax credits and up to \$45,000 in training grants based on the company's job creation plans. The town of Plainfield will consider additional property tax abatement.
