

Johnson County DEMOGRAPHICS

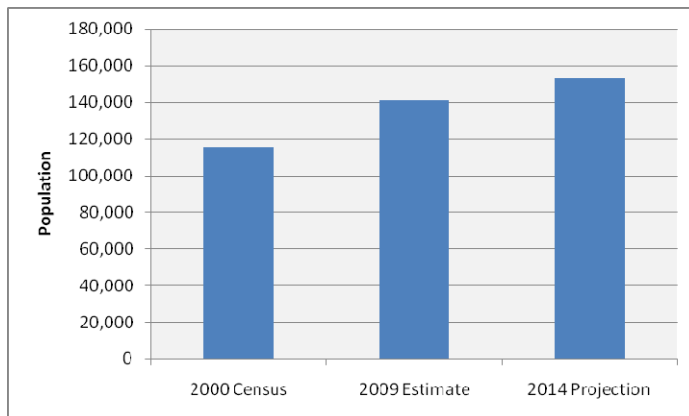
